My Canyonlands: The Adventurous Life of Kent Frost is a portrait of Kent Frost, the last of the old time riverrunners and a legendary back country guide from southeast Utah's canyon country. Now in his 90's, as a boy Kent explored the wild canyons on foot; as a man, he ran its rivers, developed backcountry tourism, and helped create Canyonlands National Park. We see the loss of Glen Canyon and changing perceptions of the land through Kent's eyes. **My Canyonlands** also shows the impact one person can have on our perceptions of a place – and the importance of person to person testimony, not just political action, in creating change.

Award winning **Director Chris Simon** interweaves stunning photography of the landscape, stories, music, archival footage and present-day adventures to create an intimate and compelling portrait of Kent Frost and the canyons he loves.

My Canyonlands is narrated by NPR commentator Hal Cannon, who also wrote and performs "The Ballad of Kent Frost." It features environmental activists Katie Lee, Ken Sleight, author Stephen Trimble, and additional music by James Keelaghan, TR. Ritchie and Cowboy Celtic.
